From Bob and Carmen Morrison's January update:

Ethiopians Struggle to Start Online Counseling Program In mid-January, we welcomed 32 new students to our online Holistic Christian Lay Counseling program, 6 from Zambia and South Africa, and 26 from Ethiopia. The obstacles for the Ethiopian students were many, due to little English language ability, newness to the online environment, and limited internet access, even with the help of bi-lingual Ethiopians and our program administrator, Nelly. Living conditions in the capital city of Addis Ababa have deteriorated measurably, as many of those we are serving are displaced from their homes and economic and ethnic tensions continue to rise. You can imagine how much their own pain, and the pain of people around them, is motivating this group to be trained!

Despite everyone's best efforts, only 5 Ethiopian students have been able move forward to continue as part of this cohort. However, we will meet face-to-face with the others when we are in Addis Ababa this year to talk through future program adaptations for them.

Pray for the courage and ability of these five students (and the others from Zambia and South Africa) to work with us through the challenges, and for wisdom so we know what adaptations to make for the others in the future. In addition, please continue to pray for Bob & Carmen's living conditions, and their good health.
