January update from Hearts for the Homeless:

2024 was truly a monumental year for Hearts. We stepped out in faith to take on a significant kitchen renovation project that will benefit the community long into the future. The renovation has been completed, praise God! The new kitchen includes a state-of-the-art tilt skillet which has revolutionized our ability to prepare healthy meals faster and more efficiently. This advancement secures our Code Blue meal service long into the future so those seeking shelter are fed on the coldest nights. In addition to providing more hot meals for those seeking shelter during nights of Code Blue, the Commercial Kitchen renovation has opened the doors for Hearts to add a recurring lunch service for the first time in the history of our organization. Hearts' Mobile Soup Kitchen, which has served hot meals five nights a week for 35 years, is now also serving a hot lunch with sandwiches, cookies and a drink every Tuesday at the Leroy R. Coles, Jr. Branch Library in Buffalo. Our first lunch service was held on November 12, 2024. We are looking forward to building relationships and making connections in East Buffalo throughout 2025 and beyond.

Darkness	10:21-23, 10:27-29	Agreed to let them go without their flocks and then changed his mind as his heart was hardened	Not mentioned	Ra, god of the sun; even when the sun was out, there was darkness
Death of the firstborn	11:4-9	With a hard heart, he refused to release them	Not mentioned	Pharaoh, held to be a god; he could not prevent the death of his own son
