A brief history of Chosen People Ministries:

In 1894, Rabbi Leopold Cohn founded this ministry in the Brownsville section of Brooklyn, New York, shortly after he became convinced Jesus is the Messiah. In its early days, Jewish people knew the ministry as the Brownsville Mission to the Jews, and its efforts consisted of evangelism and a variety of services and classes for the growing population of Jewish immigrants. In 1988, the name of this ministry changed to Chosen People Ministries.

From humble beginnings and a history of faithful service, Chosen People Ministries stands today as a credible, well-established mission combining a commitment to Jesus and the evangelization of Jewish people with cutting-edge creativity. Their presence extends to Jewish communities in the United States, Canada, Central and South America, the former Soviet Union, Europe, Israel, Australia, and more.
